Dear Colleagues in Ministry,

There has been a flurry of activity across the diocese in the last few weeks. I hope those of you who are Synod representatives are looking forward to the October meeting - I hope to be present for some of the time, although Fr Scott will be Presiding as Vicar General.

After some prevarication between medical professionals, some minor surgical procedures for me scheduled for Thursday this week have been put on hold. Physiotherapy, twice a day, means that my muscles are nearly always tired and I look forward to lights out at 9pm each night! While my mobility has improved immensely, it seems likely that wheelchair support will be important into the future. This is not what I was hoping for, but reality must be embraced! For the next couple of weeks I am likely to remain here in Rehab at the Peter Heinz Unit. The wholistic, team care approach is excellent, and I am grateful for your ongoing prayers and love.

Guardian Angels - Angel of the North

The Angel of the North is a contemporary sculpture by Antony Gormley, located in Gateshead, Tyne and Wear, England. Completed in 1998, it is believed to be the largest sculpture of an angel in the world and is viewed by an estimated 33 million people every year due to its proximity to the A1 and A167 roads and the East Coast Main Line. I always think of this magnificent structure on and around the Feast of Saint Michael and All Angels. Its imposing presence and majestic wingspan seems to portray both a welcoming and protective embrace. When we gather for celebrations of the Eucharist we do so 'with angels, archangel and all the company of heaven', as we sing God's praises, reflect the sacred scriptures, offer our prayers and receive the sacramental graces we require for our earthly pilgrimage. May we be grateful for the our guardian 'angels' or messengers of God and for their protective embrace.

Diocesan Synod

I look forward to welcoming you to our diocesan Synod to be held at the Diocesan Centre, Ballarat on the 18th to 19th October.

The gathering of people from across the Diocese is always a joyous occasion. It also is a time when we conduct the business and look to the future with hope.

This year the Bishop's Appeal and Anglicare Victoria are inviting members of Synod to again bring gift to assist with the care of the vulnerable and those in need across the diocese. The Sixteenth meeting of the UN Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity will be held 21 October–1 November 2024 at Cali, Colombia. The Anglican Communion will be represented there. The theme developed by the delegations for presentation at both COPs is "to plant hope, plant peace, plant wisdom, plant justice, and plant wellbeing". The presence of the Anglican delegations at these critical UN meetings is to represent the worldwide Anglican Communion of 85 million people from 165 countries. Particular attention will be given to representing people who are suffering as a result of environmental degradation and whose voice is not often heard. Please pray for the delegations, for the governments attending, and for outcomes of justice.
